## Re: Consultation Grow Op Free Alberta

RECA would like to thank you and your staff again for the invitation to participate in the May, 2013 consultations with respect to a Grow Op Free Alberta.

As a follow up to the meeting, RECA is providing this short written response outlining the themes RECA presented during the consultation meeting. Specifically, once a property is identified as an illegal grow op in Alberta, the following is recommended as forming part of government's legislative and other responses to illegal grow ops:

- The remediation process ought to be transparent for the property owner and the community at large
- The steps in the remediation process should be publicly available, including the phase at which any particular property is in the remediation process
- Due process, including notice, should be afforded property owners and those holding mortgages on affected properties
- The rights of the public/community must be balanced against privacy rights
- The public interest should always trump other interests, including privacy interests
- A central coordinator in the property remediating process will be required
- The remediation process should be timely from the time of detection to remediation completion
- Remediation costs should flow with the land and these should be recoverable from the property owner but if not, from the land itself
